Please be prepared to provide sources and permissions for photographs and images.

Permissions for use of images not the property of the submitter are the responsibility of the submitter. Photography: 200-500 word statement about your proposal. - All photographs should be submitted full color (CMYK), and in either JPEG or TIFF format. - Send all photographs with a 300 dpi resolution.

Projects: Send all photographs with a 300 dpi resolution and a 200 to 500 word statement describing your project.
